INTRODUCTION

"A font is a complete set of characters -- letters, numbers, and symbols -- that share a common weight, width and style, such as 10-pt Garamond.

Typefaces (often called type families or font families) are collections of fonts that share an overall appearance, and are designed to be used together . . . Light, Bold, Extra Bold, Italic, Extended, Condensed etc.

What do you know about 'AMPERSAND' ?

When creating a new typeface, a designer can inject the most artistic flair into the ampersand character. The term ampersand, as Geoffrey Glaister writes is a corruption of and (&) per se and, which literally means "(the character) & by itself (is the word)

and." The symbol & is derived from the ligature of ET or et, which is the Latin word for "and."

A long time ago, when learning the alphabet at school, children memorized it by saying from A, "A-per-se-A, B-per-se-B, ..." (A by itself A, B by itself B). And then, when they finished Z, there was an "&" and they said, "and-per-se-and." That became 'ampersand'.
